Year 2 Weekly Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

PE kit

Please ensure that your child has socks in their PE kit. This is important as feet sometimes get wet so to change afterwards is important and if girls are wearing tights, they require socks before they can wear their trainers. If children wear lace-up trainers, please ensure they can tie them independently.

Reading

Thank you for supporting your child with their reading at home. We continue to promote and put a big focus on reading. We are encouraging the children to read every evening either alone or with an adult.

Maths

This week, we will:

- Calculate multiplication and division mentally.
- Begin to learn multiplication facts.
- Solve word problems by applying knowledge of multiplication and division.
- Study odd and even numbers
- Learn doubles and halves to 15.



English

This week, we will;

- Complete an elicitation task about our new sequence of learning.
- Read and explore our new fiction text.
- Discuss different viewpoints.
- Text map our new story.
- Make predictions about what will happen next in the story.

Music

We continue to learn to play the Ocarina. The children made super progress in their first lesson. This is a wind instrument suitable for KS1 children. We will spend up until Easter learning and then perform at the Spring Music Festival.

Art

This week, we continue a sequence of learning about the Russian abstract artist Wassily Kandinsky. This week we will be exploring warm and cool colours and expressing our ideas in collage.

Science

This week, we continue a sequence of learning entitled 'Living things and their habitats'. This week we will learn about woodland habitats and microhabitats.

History

This week, we continue to learn about the life and works of Florence Nightingale and her impact on modern day nursing. This week we will study and sequence the key events in Florence Nightingale's life chronologically.

Homework

Homework is set on a Friday and should be returned by the following Thursday. Children should work for half an hour and complete as much as possible. Homework is designed as a consolidation exercise and as an opportunity for demonstrating knowledge and understanding and should not be onerous.

Spelling

A spelling test of 10 of the words containing the spelling pattern taught will take place on Fridays. Scores will be recorded in the Home-school diary.



General information

- P.E. kits, reading books and home-school diaries will be needed in school every day. PE kits can be left on their peg.
- As the weather is colder and wetter, please ensure that your child has an appropriate coat in school every day.
- As always, it is important to label all your child's belongings with your child's name.

Year 2 Information

- A labelled drink bottle for WATER should be brought to school each day.
- Your child will bring home a reading book to read with an adult at home. They will also bring home a phonics-based book which should be read every day at home and can be changed on Mondays and Thursdays. This is to enable the phonic patterns to be embedded through repeated reading of the text containing the sound.
- Children have an opportunity to change their library book after a book quiz each day.
- PE lessons will take place on Mondays (outdoors) and Fridays (indoors).
- We love to hear about important events or occasions in the children's lives. We set aside a short amount of 'show and tell time' once a week, usually on a Monday. This is the weekly opportunity to share with the class or bring in special things to show.
- Children will take part in various guided group activities with their teacher or teaching assistant each week.
- Please ensure that important information is communicated to school using the home-school diary. For example, if somebody else is collecting your child from school or if your child has a medical appointment. Please ask your child to make us aware of messages.

Please do not hesitate to speak to us if you have any worries, concerns or questions.
